Proposed Work


Parts of the organ will be transported to the builder's Brisbane workshop where they will be fully refurbished. The work will include:

- Careful restoration of the original pipework to preserve its original tonal qualities.
- Judicious additions to the original specification in keeping with the other work of the Roberts firm.
- Restoration of the two slider windchests
- Overhaul of the 1986 Larner console
- Adaptation of the internal framing and casework
- Installation of a new electric swell engine
- Installation of new electric stop actions
- Installation of a new solid-state control system
- Installation of a humidifier

The organ will then be returned to Lower Chittering and reassembled in the rear gallery. The action and pipework will be regulated and fine-tuned to achieve optimum results.



Organ background

The Lower Chittering organ was built for St Andrew's Presbyterian Church in central Perth by Roberts Ltd of Adelaide, at a cost of £1,641. It was opened in December 1924. Job number 73, it was one of five organs contracted to the firm for clients in Western Australia.



William Leopold Roberts was born in Bramley, Leeds in 1882 and was apprenticed to Leeds organ builder J.J. Binns. He emigrated to Australia in 1909 and started his own business around 1915. He completed in excess of 170 contracts in four Australian states and died in 1971.

The Chittering organ is a substantial example of Roberts's work with a very fine organ case. The action was electrified in 1953 by J.E. Dodd & Sons and the instrument was further rebuilt and enlarged in 1986 by Perth organ builder F.J. Larner.

The organ is to be relocated to Lower Chittering Church and placed in the rear gallery. Although the organ is not in its original condition, this adaptive re-use project will ensure the final result closely reflects the tonal ideals of W. L. Roberts. Many of the 1986 alterations will therefore be reversed.

Statement of Significance

The Lower Chittering organ was the largest new organ constructed by Roberts Ltd for a client in Western Australia and was an important civic instrument, located directly across the road from Government House. Although the organ's original actions and console are no longer extant, it retains its original pipework, windchests and elaborate casework, incorporating multiple towers and flats on two storeys and is a rare example of the firm's work that retains its original character.

The Organ Builder

The work is to be carried out by Pierce Pipe Organs Pty Ltd, Hemmant, Qld which has completed a number of successful organ projects in Australia and in New Zealand, including St John's Cathedral and the City Hall in Brisbane, and St Mary's in Auckland.
